CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2008 (Annual General Meeting 18th May 2009)

The Annual Report of the Community Association is an excellent opportunity to review the activities of the Association over the last 12 months and to look forward to where we are now and where we are going next. The report is sent to the Charity Commissioners as part of our annual return to them.

This year is the 25th anniversary of the opening of the Village Hall by the Duke of Westminster. We invited him back to share our success, but he is unable to attend. We have had a superb reaction from the people in the village, however, who have volunteered to arrange a village fête. This will take place on Saturday 11th July starting at 1.30 pm. (Next year the fête will take place on 10th July)

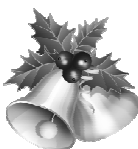
I'm sure you all know by now that it is to take place on the school field in Arrowcroft Road. There will be an arena in the middle of the field with the stalls and sideshows surrounding it. The arena will have various activities throughout the day, including a children's fancy dress competition, children dancing, etc. There will also be a band, a beer tent, and lots of other attractions.

The first village fête that I helped with took place in 1986. It was held on Mr Willis's field off School Lane and followed on after the end of the Sutton Six Run and Fun Runs. There were a lot of similarities in the events held at that fête with this year's – the stalls and sideshows, the band and the children dancing, all of which make it a typical village fête.

Intriguingly, there were also a sheep dog trial and a duck trial at the 1986 fête. We don't have those this year, but we will have our specialties as well. At that time, the programme said that the Community Association still needed £10,000 and still needed to raise funds.

The programme went on to say, 'Apart from being a marvellous day out for the people of the village, the fête will do much to reduce our debt and help fund new projects for the benefit of the community'. We have moved on a lot since then, but essentially that's what it is all about.

The 1986 fête was the last of the big old style fetes. Smaller ones took place after that, mostly based at the Hall, but this year, using the school field, we are trying to repeat the heady days of the 80's.

Looking back to the Village Hall, we installed a fence at the side of the Hall last year. This was asked for by Pre-School, but other Users will be able to take advantage of it. It was quite expensive, but it has made a very attractive fenced area at the side. We were thanked by the young children for providing it. They prepared a booklet of photos and drawings and it was passed round at one of our HMC meetings.

We arranged for the installation of some lights outside the Hall following an accident, when someone fell over in the dark. These are a definite improvement and have been well received by Hall Users. We have also had a lot of maintenance work done on the Hall over the last 2 years, as the Accounts will soon show. We have spent over £13,000 over this period, most of this has been on the Hall's heating system. When these things go wrong, they are expensive to fix.

Can I do my usual thank you's for all the people who do so much for the Hall and for the village. Firstly, thanks to Trisha Paterson as Booking Secretary for all the work that she does every day for the Hall by looking after bookings and making sure the Users have the keys, etc. Trisha has said that she wants to give up the job of Booking Secretary, so we need someone to take over from her. This is very important job because the person looks after all the temporary bookings in the Hall. So, if we don't have a Booking Secretary, we will not be able to hire out the Hall for children's parties, etc.

John Riley is the lottery promoter and we will go through the Accounts of the village lottery later. It is still going well, and contributed over £700 to the Association's funds last year. Thanks to John.

The Village Quiz is also going strong, I'm glad to say. My thanks, as always, to Al Christmas for compiling the Quiz and to his team for marking it. Thanks also to Ruth Connolly and Laura Beresford, who do most of the organisation for it.

I am grateful to Richard Batterham and the West Cheshire AC, who continue to organise the Sutton Six and Fun Runs. These races continue to be successful every year. My thanks also to the other Groups in the village, who help out with refreshments and the like.

Thanks to John Beavan for his editing of the *Marigold* newsletter, which he has done for some years now. Everyone enjoys the *Marigold*, newcomers and existing mem-

bers of the village as it lets them know what is going on in the Hall. Thanks also to those who deliver the *Marigold* around the village, some of whom have done it for many years.

Guilden Sutton Preschool

Preschool will be 25 years old in March 2011. There must be many people who have been to preschool and still live in the village.

We will be arranging a celebration of the event although details are not finalised yet.

During the autumn term, we have been looking at things linked to space, light and dark. This has allowed us to make some extremely large pictures and play with torches. We continue to make full use of the fenced area outside the marigold room.

Preschool meets in the Village Hall during term times. We are open to any child from the age of 2½ years to 5 years. Nursery education vouchers are available for 3 and 4 year olds from the term after their 3rd birthday.

We offer a wide range of activities including painting, sand, music, baking, and messy play. All activities are planned to provide each child with an opportunity to develop and learn new skills. Special stepping stone sessions are held for children who will be starting school in the next year which include packed lunches, regular visits to the primary school and PE activities.

Each session at Preschool last 3 hours, we are open 38 weeks a year, with similar dates to the Primary School.

Sutton Six 10K race and Fun Run

The Sutton Six 10K was held this year on Sunday 20th September. The weather was very kind yet again. Running conditions were almost perfect, no wind, nice and dry but perhaps a little too warm. Fantastic weather for the spectators though and it was very encouraging to see so many people out cheering the runners on. The 10K race saw a total entry of 273 with 245 participants and finishers on the day. The race was again the final race in the Cheshire Grand prix series. First to complete the 6.25 mile course at the Village Hall was Nick Jones from Spectrum Striders (Warrington) way out in front with a time of 31:39, ahead of Damian Nicholls, last year's winner, from Wilmslow RC in a still very respectable 32 min 40 secs. With strength in depth (again!) Wilmslow AC men guaranteed themselves the men's team prize with 39 points, well ahead of South Cheshire Harriers who came second with 62 points. Wilmslow also claiming the women's team prize, with their own ladies B team coming second. First lady home was Nicky Bird of Ellesmere Port RC in a time of 37:41 well ahead of Kristy Readman from Macclesfield Harriers in a time of 39:45. At the other end of the race the last runner home clocked a time of 68:12.

The Fun Run entries this year totalled 88 (same as last year!) of whom 86 crossed the finish line. They started off at 12-15 from Hilltop Road, to complete two laps of Oaklands (about 1½ miles) before finishing back at the Village Hall. All finishers were given a medal. First home was Matthew Gilmour of Christleton High School in a time of 9 min 53 sec beating Thomas Croft also of Christleton High by 36secs. First in running for Guilden Sutton Primary School was Charlie James in 3rd place in a very good time of 10:39. Guilden Sutton Primary put on another good showing with a total of 40 finishers, over double last year's entry and a new record, again!

Guilden Sutton Cubs lead by new Akela Judith Lathaen and helpers put on an excellent spread of refreshments to give their funds another healthy boost. This year the local Guides also helped out by looking after the water station at the finish.

Thanks go out as always to the village residents and Community Association members who, together with a large contingent of West Cheshire AC club members, marshalled the course and made the day another great success overall. Special mention of thanks is a must for Ruth and Derek Hughes who have made the entries desk in the Village hall on the morning of the race their own. Thanks also to those who moved their cars for us and the significant numbers of people stationed at various points around the village who just came out to watch, providing support and much needed encouragement for the runners. Grateful thanks for the continuing support given by Mr & Mrs Sandlin of Belle Vue Farm, who again allowed us the use of a field for use as a car park, so keeping all the runners cars off the streets. Hope to see you all again next September, Sunday 19th is the day.
