COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

The last copy of the Marigold showed a report from the Annual General Meeting of the Association where members felt that it is now right to review the Association's Constitution. The Constitution was set up nearly 30 years ago, before the Village Hall was even built, so it is felt the time is right to review it to see if it reflects the current wishes of the members and the present structure of the Association.

The AGM asked the Executive Committee to recommend how to take the next step in this process and the Executive decided to call a General Meeting to invite members of the village to discuss and agree any changes to the Constitution and the meeting took place in November at the Village Hall. Before the meeting was held, a flyer was delivered around the village inviting all residents of Guilden Sutton to the meeting to consider the preparation of an amended Constitution.

The leaflet explained that the Constitution was drawn up in 1982 and may have become distant from the current needs of the village community. In fact, some parts of the Constitution have never been set up, so we need to make sure that it is still relevant to the residents of the village.

The meeting was led by a person from the village who has experience of drafting Constitutions. Many people attended the meeting and stayed until 10 pm to give their views on how the Constitution should be set up. The detailed discussions from the meeting can be found on the village website at www.guildensutton.org.uk

Some of the headings discussed at the meeting can be mentioned here. The Constitution's objectives were still considered appropriate, but would benefit from being brought up to date to reflect the changes in legislation since 1982. The original membership categories seem too complicated and would be improved if they are simplified. The large body, called the Council in the Constitution, seems out of place, as it has never met and would be too large practically. One of the specific responsibilities of the Executive Committee would be to consider strategic issues for the Association at its meetings twice a year.

Again, all members of the village are invited to the meeting, which will start at 8.15 pm. It is hoped that there is a large attendance to continue the discussion and to agree as much of a new Constitution as possible. The AGM of the Association will be held next May and it would be a great achievement if a new Constitution could be presented to that meeting and voted on.

Sutton Six 10K and Fun Run

The Sutton Six 10K was held this year on Sunday 19th September. Just for a change to the recent past the weather was not good. Heavy rain overnight on Saturday resulted in a very soggy car park field and we unfortunately had to abandon the field, for the first time in the history of the race. Apologies to those in the village who found cars parked in the roads close to their homes. The rain stopped just before the start of the main 10K race and a somewhat reduced field set off in conditions which were very damp underfoot, but no wind to speak of. Fortunately the weather did not put off the spectators from the village, a good crowd turned out to watch and cheer on the runners. This is always much appreciated by the participants. The 10K race saw a total entry of 235 with 205 participants and finishers on the day. First to complete the 6.25 mile course at the Village Hall was Andrew Lamont from Macclesfield Harriers in a time of 34:14, 30 seconds ahead of second place man Rob Tudor of West Cheshire AC. West Cheshire AC scored well with four men home in the first 11, taking the team prize. First lady home was Alison Cole of Ellesmere Port RC in a time of 40:42 just 12 seconds ahead of Alison Draper of Spectrum Striders. At the other end of the race the last runner home clocked a time of 76:07.

The Fun Run entries this year totalled 83 - an excellent entry considering the appalling weather during the early part of the morning when people were signing up to run. Ruth Hughes did a sterling job of taking the entries as they poured in quite late on. They started off at 12-15 from Hilltop Road, to complete two laps of Oaklands (about 1½ miles) before finishing back at the Village Hall. All finishers were given a medal. First home was Elijah Montez Brown of West Cheshire AC in a very creditable 9:21, followed by Joseph Morrison and Cameron Weaver, also of West Cheshire AC in times of 9:24 and 9:34 respectively. First home for Guilden Sutton Primary was Charlie James in 4th place in an excellent time of 9:47, over 50 seconds faster than his time last year. Well done Charlie! Guilden Sutton Primary put on another good showing with a total of 22 finishers.

Guilden Sutton Cubs lead by Akela Judith Lathean and helpers put on an excellent spread of refreshments to give their funds another healthy boost in spite of the weather and lower overall numbers of runners. The local Guides also helped out again by looking after the water station at the finish.

Thanks go out as always to the village residents and Community Association members who, together with a large contingent of West Cheshire AC club members, marshalled the course and made the day another great success overall. Special

Methodist Church

The Methodist Church, sadly, closed for worship on 5 September 2010 after 170 years in Guilden Sutton. The lovely building was the centre of village activity, until the building of the Village Hall, and is still used today by the Scouts.

The Village Hall is very well utilised, and there are few opportunities for additional activities to be arranged there, and so enquiries are being made to see if it is feasible to keep the Church building available as a Community Asset. It would be necessary to establish a regular use, so as to alleviate the running costs, and so the viability of setting up a Community cafe is being considered, with internet access.

It's situation close to the end of the Millennium Cycleway would, hopefully, mean that people would have a destination to visit, with a meal and drinks available, before they head back to Chester or Wales. We also envisage that it could be a venue for cycle or walking clubs to meet.

It would be nice to have a place that can host the pensioner lunches that were held at one time, and to have a heritage centre to house the photo albums and books of the village. It could also be an ideal location for different crafts, or hobby groups to meet.
