## **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2010**

The Annual Report of the Community Association is a review of our activities over the last 12 months and is part of the formal return to the Charity Commissioners that all charities must make.

The emphasis in the work of the Association over the last 12 months has been on improving and developing a new Constitution. The original Constitution had been prepared about 30 years ago and has just become out of step with the way that the Association is being run now.

The objectives have remained the same. The first of these has always been and will continue to be to promote the benefits of the inhabitants of Guilden Sutton without distinction of sex or of political, religious or other opinions and to provide facilities for recreation and leisure time occupation to improve the conditions of life. Its other main object was to establish a Village Hall.

This was built many years ago and has been very successful. We now have a very busy Village Hall, which is an excellent asset to the village. It provides facilities for a wide range of activities, and involves a large cross section of local people from all over the village, of all ages. So it is of considerable benefit to a large number of people.

The work over the last 12 months has been to look mainly at the organisational side of the Constitution and to bring it up to date with the latest legislation provisions and generally to simplify it. During this time various notifications have been sent to every household in the village, two public meetings have been held here in the Village Hall and information has been updated on the village website.

The process has been led by Kathryn Foreman who has experience in drafting Constitutions and who has spent a lot of time helping us with this change. She has chaired the public meetings and had several discussions with the Charity Commissioners to ask their advice about a number of things on our behalf.

She has now prepared the final version of the Constitution, based on the points made at the public meetings and the way that all interested members of the village wanted it to be drafted. The intention is to confirm this version at the AGM, so that we can proceed using the new Constitution.

I am very grateful for all the work that Kathryn has done regarding the new Constitution and I would like to thank her for all the time and energy she has put in.

Turning to the day to day work in the Hall, the inside of the Hall was refreshed on the annual painting rota. Each year a different part of the Hall is painted and this year it was the turn of the Main Hall and Marigold Room. There is a lot of other regular work done throughout the year in the Hall to make sure it is clean, safe and secure for all our Users, all of which is arranged by volunteers.

Going to my usual thank you's for all the people who do so much for the Association on a totally voluntary basis. Firstly, thanks to Marion Burrell as the outgoing Treasurer of the Hall. Marion did the job for around 20 years, which is a massive contribution to the Association. In that time, Marion has paid thousands of invoices for the Hall and prepared the Annual Accounts for the Hall every year. Marion deserves a huge thank you for all her work.

Kath Avery has just taken over as Treasurer and we are very grateful to Kath for offering to do this. Mr and Mrs Avery already do a lot for the Hall in their separate jobs as Booking Secretary and Treasurer and aren't we lucky that they are happy to do this?

Thanks to Ruth Connolly for the preparation of the Annual Accounts. Ruth will take us through them in a few minutes and answer any queries anyone has. I am grateful also to Derek Tubman for auditing the Accounts, which he has done for many years now.

John Riley is the lottery promoter and we will go through the Accounts of the village lottery later. John continues to do a remarkable job with the lottery, which is all the more amazing because he has done it for so long. The lottery contributed over £600 to the Association's funds last year. Thanks to John for all his work.

I am sure that the lottery team has raised more funds over the many years than anyone else in the Association. In recent years, the contribution from the lottery has been around £600, but originally when there were more people in it, the surplus was a lot more. If you think about a contribution of even £600 for 25 to 30 years, it comes to quite a lot of money.

The Village Quiz is also going strong, I'm glad to say. My thanks, as always, to Al Christmas for compiling the Quiz and to his team for marking it. Thanks also to

## Methodist Church

Attempts are being made to keep the Methodist Church available as a Scout Hut and a Community building. Our Village Hall is widely used, but has, sometimes, to turn people/groups away due to lack of space, so there is some call for additional facilities. We would look to run in harmony with the Hall, not in competition.

The Methodist Circuit have kindly agreed to give us 6 months, to attempt to raise the necessary funds to maintain this lovely building which we would rent from them, otherwise they will be selling the building.

We have therefore, set up a group MC<sup>2</sup> to raise awareness and to organise fund raising events. If you want to get involved contact me or Sue Davies see details below. We would be looking to set up a Community Library, where books will be available both for adults and children to borrow, and so we will need donations of books. Likewise, DVD's donated could be loaned. To access these things, regular coffee mornings would be held, as well as evening drop in sessions.

In the long term, we would like to make it a heritage centre to house the photo albums and books of the village, if we can get the necessary funds. Plans are being made to scan the extensive photographs left by Arthur Willis, who sadly died recently, and we would like to show them on a heritage evening on 10th September. It could also be an ideal location for different crafts, or hobby groups to meet, if you could use the space, please contact me. The more plans we have for future use of the church, the better.

There are 600+ houses in the village, if every household pledged £5 a year we would have the necessary commitment to show the Circuit there is a desire to keep this lovely building available to all. This payment would be the membership needed to borrow the books, and to hire the hall at preferential rates, and be available to "Friends of MC<sup>2</sup>" living outside the village.

## **GULDEN SUTTON OLD SCHOOL HOUSE TRUST**

*Registered Charity No. 1066844*

### **What is it?**

The Trust supports financially the education or personal development of young people who attend or have attended Guilden Sutton Church of England Primary School. Grants can be made to the school as well as to current or former pupils who apply to the Trust.

Previous grants to individuals have been in the range from £50 to £500 and have helped fund: the purchase of musical instruments, textbooks and other items of equipment; gap year projects; higher/further education expenses; voluntary work; overseas study, etc. The trust was set up in 1997 by the Diocese of Chester using the proceeds of the sale of the Old School House, situated at the west end of the village.

## **Guilden Sutton student saddles up for epic charity ride across Australia**

A cycling fanatic from Cinder Lane is preparing for his third and most challenging charity cycle ride yet– the equivalent of cycling from Chester to London 17 times.

Hot on the wheels of rides from London to Monaco, and from Land's End to John O'Groats, Jon Shorter is now set to ride over 2,800 miles from the southern shores to the northern tip of Australia over 40 days to raise funds for The Prostate Cancer Charity in Britain and the Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia.

Jon, a mature Forensic Computing student, set himself the challenge of pledging his summer university holidays to raise awareness and fundraise for different charities over three years.

Jon, who will attempt the epic ride from 30th July, said "I wanted to make the best possible use of my time as a student and setting myself ever more ambitious challenges and fundraising targets seemed a better idea than the typical student holiday of lazing around, costly festivals or backpacking!"

A typical day on the trip will see Jon and his Aussie cycling partner Chris ride more than 100 miles through the winter, each pulling a trailer weighing 65 pounds over the snowy peaks of the Baw Baw National Park, across the desert sands of North Queensland and through crocodile-infested creeks and rivers in Cape York. The pair will carry all their equipment with no back-up vehicles or support.

Jon would like to raise £15,000 from this ride. He said: "Every year in the UK 37,000 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer and I would dearly like to help fund more research into what is now the most common form of cancer in men."

Mark Bishop, Director of Fundraising for The Prostate Cancer Charity said: "It's fantastic that Jon is gearing up to cycle across Australia to support us. We rely on people like Jon to help fund our work supporting people affected by prostate cancer and we're enormously grateful and quite frankly amazed by his plans to cycle around over 2,800 miles for us! It's an effort for me to cycle down the shops let alone thousands of miles, so all credit to Jon. We wish him the best of luck in his amazing adventure."
