## UPDATE AT THE VILLAGE HALL

The Village Hall is showing its age and needs some money spent on the building and its immediate surrounds. We have had a three year programme of painting for a number of years at the Hall. This covers the Main Hall and Marigold Room one year, the entrance hall, toilets and other rooms around the Hall the next year and the exterior of the building in the third year of the rota.

This year it was the turn of the outside to be painted and when we came to arrange for it to be done, it became apparent that we could not just paint over the existing wood. It had been filled and painted over a couple of times already and it was now time to think about replacing the fascia panels at each end of the building.

After asking for several quotes and looking at a number of options, we have decided on a supplier and the work will be starting soon (or will have been done by the time this is published).

Another area we have been looking at is the front of the Hall. The weather the last few winters has been particularly bad and the steps and the slope leading to the Hall door have been a potential risk area for people going to the Hall, so we have decided to provide a handrail for the steps and at the side of the Hall up the slope outside the Marigold Room.

We have extended the safety improvement outside the Hall at the front by having a handrail put along the top of the wall to reduce the risk of anyone falling over the wall. This will benefit all who use the Hall or walk past it.

**Sutton Six and Fun Run**

The Sutton Six 10K was held this year on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> September. This year was the 30<sup>th</sup> race since the race was created as part of the original Village Fair – a fund raiser for the Village Hall construction. Good fortune smiled upon us again and the weather was very good, perfect for running and the car parking in the field went well. The number of runners was up on last year, primarily because of the fact that the race was the last of the Cheshire Grand Prix series, but also because the weather was better. As I ran round the course it was evident that spectator support was very good within the village, lots of cheering and clapping. This is always much appreciated by the participants. The 10K race saw a total entry of 267 with 230 participants and finishers on the day. First to complete the 6.25 mile course at the Village Hall was Tarus Elly from Salford Harriers in a time of 31:40, just 1 second outside the course record and 60 seconds ahead of second place man David Norman from Altrincham AC. First man home for West Cheshire AC was Rob Tudor in 6<sup>th</sup> place in 33:37 - over a minute faster than last year. First lady home was Michelle Ross-Cope of City of Stoke AC in a time of 34:01, second lady, Marilyn Kitchin of Tattenhall Runners, finishing in 37:36. It was a very strong field this year with no less than 7 new age category course records being set. At the other end of the race the last runner home clocked a time of 75:34.

The Fun Run entries this year totalled 75 – another very good entry. Ruth Hughes did a sterling job, yet again, of taking the entries as they poured in quite late on. They started off at 12-15 from Hilltop Road, to complete two laps of Oaklands (about 1½ miles) before finishing back at the Village Hall.

First home was Elisha Walker of Stafford Harriers in a very creditable 9:08, followed by Joseph Morrison and Paul Morrison, both of West Cheshire AC, in times of 9:20 and 10:04 respectively. First home for Guilden Sutton Primary was Owen Hughes in 4th place in an excellent time of 10:08. Well done Owen! Guilden Sutton Primary put on another good showing with a total of 22 finishers, same as last year!

Guilden Sutton Cubs lead by Akela Judith Lathean and Kathryn Foreman together with all their helpers put on an excellent spread of refreshments to give their funds another healthy boost. The local Guides also helped out again by looking after the water station at the finish.

Thanks go out as always to the village residents and Community Association members who, together with a large contingent of West Cheshire AC club members, marshaled the course and made the day another great success overall. Special mention of thanks is a must for Ruth and Derek Hughes who took entries on the day and did some marshalling. Thanks also to those who moved their cars for us and to the significant numbers of people stationed at various points around the village who just came out to watch, providing support and much needed encouragement for the runners. Grateful thanks also for the continuing support given by Mr & Mrs Sandlin of Belle Vue Farm, who again gave us permission to use a field as a car park.

Hope to see you all again next September - Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> is the provisional date.

We cater for all abilities in a number of different groups, so if you want to get out and run as part of a group you will be made welcome.
