Annual General Meeting 22nd May 2017 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT YEAR ENDING 2016

The Chairman's report of the Community Association has 2 main purposes:

- It is part of the Annual Return to the Charity Commissioners, and
- It reminds us all what has happened over the last 12 months.

The village hall extension has been uppermost in our mind over the last year or so. It seems as though we have been working on it for ages, yet we don't have a single brick in place to show for it. Most of the work has been in the preparation of the plans for the design of the extension. We have all been very mindful of the fact that we need to make sure we get everything correct at the design stage, to avoid any expensive changes at the building stage. Even small changes then can cost a lot.

The extension will enable us to have a larger meeting room, to refurbish the toilets and to have a small amount of extra storage space. We have had a number of discussions about the new design and given everyone a chance to look at all the plans and ask lots of questions about them. We have been granted planning permission for the design, with a small change still outstanding. But that should (hopefully) be OK. We have also had building regulations agreed, so we are nearly all set to go.

The next job is to get some quotations, to evaluate them and select one of them to build our extension. We have instructed an architect to help us with this. We feel this is something we need professional guidance on. It is just too important to get wrong. After that there is the small job of applying for grants to help us with the cost of it all. This will no doubt be a huge job because we will need to apply to several organisations for support and every organisation has its own grant application procedure and its own way of working.

Funds are a lot more difficult to obtain now as well. There is much less available for organisations to provide for community projects. So, if anyone would like to help us in this process, we would be more than happy for you to join us.

The best window for us to build the extension is during the summer holiday. This year will be too close now, so let us hope that we are in a position this time next year to get things going.

The hall extension is not all we have been doing this last year. We arranged for the floors in the main hall and the Marigold room to be sanded off and resurfaced last summer. This was a significant job in itself, contacting firms to do the work, receiving quotations and then choosing the best one. And then supervising the people when they came to do the work.

But unfortunately, this was not all that had to be done. Many of the chairs that would be used on the brand new floors no longer had the rubber feet on the end of the chair legs, because the chairs are so old. This meant that all the chairs had to be checked and then, something like a hundred chairs (that is 400 feet!) had to have the old rubber ends taken off and new ones fitted to them.

Who on earth would have the patience to do all this? Well it was Peter Evans who made the time and effort to carry out this work on our behalf. Peter has also been involved in helping the cleaners to use new cleaning fluid and a new way of cleaning the floors. We owe Peter a great deal. I am glad to say that the floors are still in very fine condition. I am grateful to all our Users for looking after them properly. Let's see how long we can continue to keep them like this.

Another wonderful thing to have happened this year is the new Hall Calendar, that is the brainchild of Clive Albany. Keeping up to date with what is going on in the hall and who is using it and what times they are in, has been a difficult problem for us for some time now. When you have a hall like ours which is so well used, it is a difficult job to keep on top of things. Matt Rutter manages the bookings very well on our behalf, but I am sure it is not an easy job.

Having a calendar which is available to everyone through the village website (courtesy of Brian Lewin, the webmaster) to see what is on at the hall and where there are vacancies that people can use, has been a revelation for us. People don't need to ring Matt up now and ask him when the hall is free, they can have a look for themselves to see if it is free. Hopefully this will save on our volunteer's time and be quicker and easier for everyone.

Clive has done all the work setting this up for us and entering the times of all the bookings, but our regular Users have also been very helpful by sending their booking times into Clive very speedily.

Other volunteers I need to thank include Kath Avery for handling the day to day financial transactions for the hall and Derek Tubman, as our auditor and advisor.

Sutton Six 10K and Fun Run Sunday 17th September 2017

This year's Sutton Six races will be held again on the traditional 3rd Sunday of the month. There will be the usual two races, the 10 Km road race and the Fun Run (c. 2.5 Km). Courses are the same as in previous years.

The 10K starts in Belle Vue Lane opposite Middlecroft, does a loop of Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane/Belle Vue Lane coming back past the start point and then heading out again down Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane down to the Vets on the A51. From there the race goes down the wide pavement all the way down to Wicker lane, to come back into the village and finish at the Village Hall. Race start time will be 11:00. We will again be using chip timing (now a feature of all our races except fun runs). This will give you your result within minutes of the finish of the race via email or text to your mobile phone.

At 12:15 the Fun Run will start in Hilltop Road. This goes out via Arrowcroft Road, turning left on the pavement along School Lane up to Oaklands. Running all the way around Oaklands, back out to School Lane and then round once more before turning into Hilltop Road to get back to the finish at the Village Hall. **Entry to the Fun Run is on the day only at the Village Hall** from about 09:00, and there will be an award to all finishers.

Refreshments will be available in the Village Hall, provided as usual by the local Cubs group.

As for last year the local council's Safety Advisory Group have requested that in addition to the short term road closures in Belle Vue Lane and Middlecroft we need to implement a full road closure of Wicker Lane from the A51 junction **up to but not including** the entrance to the Byatts. Wicker Lane from the Byatts junction towards the village will remain fully open. This closure will be timed to cover runners entering and leaving this section of Wicker Lane. It is anticipated that the closure will be implemented from about 11:15 until about 11:50. If we can close the road later and open again early we will do so. We will publish full details of the proposed road closure nearer the time. In addition to this we will have the now traditional temporary road closure to cover the start of the 10K race in Belle Vue Lane. We will need to put this road closure in place on Belle Vue Lane for about 10 minutes, i.e. from approx. 10:50 to 11:00, whilst the runners are moved to the start location and the race is started. This closure will be from the junction with School Lane down to about 75 metres south of Middlecroft. Middlecroft itself will also have a road closure but only from the junction with Belle Vue Lane up to the first houses. This will be used as an assembly area for the runners prior to the start. Middlecroft and all the houses in it will remain accessible at all times from the Oaklands end. We apologise in advance for any short term disruption but hope

that local residents will bear with us for the short period whilst we get the race underway and then safely through Wicker Lane.

Rambling Group



Our programme for Spring/Summer 2017 has so far put on 6 walks visiting Caldý and the Wirral Way, Moel Findeg from Loggerheads, Shotwick Castle, Graig-fechan area (south of Ruthin), Ellesmere and Utkinton.

We have been very lucky with the weather; all have been dry and the last two if anything a bit on the warm side. The short walk around Caldý started from the car park on the Wirral Way and climbed gently up Caldý Hill and over to Grange, giving excellent views over the Dee Estuary and beyond. Dropping back down again into West Kirby we walked along the beach back to the car park. Moel Findeg was a bit more strenuous but still fairly easy. We had a long gradual ascent up from Loggerheads, partially through the woods, to the first summit looking down at Maeshafn, then down into the village before taking another path up through the woods to the summit of Moel Findeg itself. It was a wonderfully clear day and we were rewarded with views right to the horizon in all directions. Descending from Moel Findeg we returned via Gwernymynedd, Pant-glas and then back to Loggerheads Country Park.

The next walk was a very gentle stroll from Saughall around to Shotwick Castle via the Dingle Woods. The woods were absolutely full of bluebells, the timing was perfect, and after reading all about the history of Shotwick Castle we returned via the Big Wood to the Greyhound Inn at Saughall where some of the walkers stayed for lunch.

Our next venture was back into the Clwydian range, starting from the famous Three Pigeons Inn in Graig-fechan. Ascending the old drovers' road to ascend the Clwydian ridge, we passed through some woods which were absolutely full of wild garlic in full flower with glorious smells to boot. After a long gradual climb we had some fantastic views from the ridge. Walking back down via the same garlic strewn woods but from the opposite side, we returned to the Three Pigeons and had an excellent lunch.

After a short break for the school holidays we paid a return visit to Ellesmere, walking along the towpath of the Llangollen Canal past Blake Mere and Cole Mere to Welshampton and back to Ellesmere. It was a bit hot that day!

Bringing us up to date was a walk on 4th July around Utkinton through very pleasant undulating countryside. Partly using lengths of the Sandstone Trail the walk also skirted Tirley Garth before returning to the start at Rock Farm.

By the time you read this we will be in our summer recess (over the school holidays) and will start the programme again in September. Watch the village website for updates of walks for the autumn
