# 🏋 illage 🌣 reen

Discussions have taken place with the school caretaker with regard to ensuring that the shrubs in the school grounds, next to the path between Oaklands and Hilltop Rd, are cut back regularly. This is to prevent them from poking through the railings and obstructing the path, as has happened in the past. The new contract for grounds maintenance includes this task.

Village Green asked Guilden Sutton Players, who have sadly now disbanded, to donate some of their funds to the Community Association, specifically to purchase standard Photinia shrubs in large planters to be placed on the Village Hall terrace, with a suitable plague to commemorate The Players. The purchase and delivery of the shrubs will be organised once the new Hall doors are installed in April.

Village Green are still keen to give two refurbished teak benches to the Parish Council, to be placed, along with some shrubs, close to the shops, to improve that part of the village in terms of appearance and amenity. The Council will make a final decision on the matter.

#### Guilden Sutton 10K and Fun run

#### **Guilden Sutton Old School House Trust**

Registered Charity No. 1066844

The Trust was set up by the Diocese of Chester, following the sale of the old school house, to support financially the personal development of current or former pupils of Guilden Sutton Primary School. It makes grants, typically in the range £100 to £500, to support the purchase of: equipment such as musical instruments or sports equipment; gap year, uniformed group or other projects; education expenses such as books, travel etc. Applicants should be under 25 years old.

Applications should be submitted by 30 April for consideration in May or by 31 October for consideration in November each year. #### **Guilden Sutton Wildflower Garden**

The Wildflower garden area is being leased from CwaC, and the Parish Council received the proposed 15-year lease last month. CWaC want to include the steps from Church Lane in the land to be transferred. This would be an additional liability for the Parish Council, which they don't particularly want, so it's yet to be agreed.

Spacehive is still holding the money that was donated until such time as the lease is agreed. Money raised at the Film Club for community use was kindly donated to pay for the initial seed and bulb planting.

There will inevitably be garden patches where the seeds didn't grow. We have extra seeds available to sow when the ground is warmer.

We were advised to delay installing bird boxes until the second year to ensure the flower seeds have established.

We'll monitor the damp areas and ensure the paths are mown in the drier regions. We will try to take remedial action by planting flag iris. Hopefully, the first wildflowers will start appearing soon. Winter aconites, snowdrops and daffodils are already in flower in the bulb area under the trees.
