# Guilden Sutton 10K and Fun Run Sunday 21st September 2025

This year's Sutton Six races will be held again on the traditional 3rd Sunday of the month.

The 10K starts in Belle Vue Lane opposite Middlecroft, does a loop of Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane/Belle Vue Lane, coming back past the start point and then heading out again down Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane down to the Vets on the A51. From there, the race goes down the wide



pavement to Wicker Lane, coming back into the village to finish at the Village Hall. The race start time is 11:00. Chip timing will provide your result within minutes of the race finish via email or text to your mobile phone.

At 12:15, the Fun Run will start on Hilltop Road. This route follows Arrowcroft Road, turning left onto School Lane and proceeding up to Oaklands. It then runs all the way around Oaklands, back out to School Lane, and makes one final turn before entering Hilltop Road to finish at the Village Hall. Entries for the Fun Run are available on the day only at the Village Hall, starting around 09:00. An award will be presented to all finishers.

Refreshments will be available in the Village Hall, provided by the local Cubs group.

Temporary road closures will be implemented for the Start in Belle Vue Lane (from approx. 10:50 until 11:05 and also Wicker Lane (from A51 junction down to but not including the junction to The Byatts) from about 11:15 until about 11:50. Apologies for any short-term disruption.

The winning entries of the photographic competition are on the website where you will also find a final report. Money donated by individuals, CW&C, and the Cinema Club funded the clearing of the site, seed sowing, bulb planting, and the purchase of the noticeboard, herb-planters and bench. The Parish Council retains the remainder of the funds, which are ringfenced to cover the costs of routine grass cutting and annual flower maintenance.

We continue to plant seeds when necessary to fill any gaps and to enhance the varieties growing there, as well as cut the paths through the flowers. The bench will be permanently anchored when we have established the best location away from any damp patches.

The Wildflower Group will continue to monitor the garden. If volunteers are needed we will put notices on the Fox Meadow noticeboard and social media. Thanks again to everyone who has been involved.
